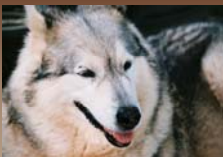


## Saint Francis of Assisi

Sadly there is a marked decrease in wolf songs. Texas Parks and Wildlife tell us the wolf is officially extinct in the State of Texas.

In 2002, Jean LeFevre met three wolves who were being treated at a local veterinary clinic. Despite the veterinarian's best efforts, one wolf died after being released to a local reserve. The other two remained in holding cages with no exterior windows. Jean visited them over several months and was inspired to secure the requisite County, State and Federal licenses to found and establish the Saint Francis Wolf Sanctuary.

The animals seem to sense that they have found a protective environment and caretakers who treat them with genuine love and affection. We would like to continue serving our Magnificent Wolf Brethren, but we need help. All donations directly benefit the wolves.



The Saint Francis Wolf Sanctuary has been inspected and licensed by the Montgomery County Animal Control Authority. USDA Federal Authority Permit #74C0564 was also granted on Nov. 6th, 2002. The land is privately owned and leased to the St. Francis Sanctuary for one dollar per year. No hunting, shooting, trapping or fishing is permitted. An education program is under development to involve young people, the disabled, veterans and those wishing to pursue a humane career in this field.
